Housing

- Building and maintaining council housing at council rents
- Scrutinise council policy for transparency, equity, and accountability to our communities
- Decent homes at affordable rents with a private tenants charter and renters union
- Engage with families, health services, SGTO, TRAs and others for their ideas on how to strengthen tenants and community voices and ensure housing needs, including repairs
- No infills without community consent



Public Services
